THE LIAR

A compulsive liar, misunderstandings, complications, romance gone wrong, and a conflicted Italian father. An episode of *The Sopranos*? Not quite.

In *The Liar*, Carlo Goldoni created a delightful romp through the manners and customs of 18th century Italy. A master of comedy, Goldoni mined the classic vein of commedia dell'arte, employing slapstick, pratfalls, wit and—oh yeah—some romance and music. But he was also an innovator, creating realistic characters who continue to inspire modern comedians such as the Marx Brothers, Jackie Gleason and Art Carney, and Roberto Benigni. [Was it a coincidence that Jim Carrey starred in *Liar*, *Liar*?—I think not!]
